Reflections on Readings for the
Third Sunday of Advent

*"This Is The One About Whom It Is Written:
 Behold, I Am Sending My Messenger Ahead Of You"*

This Sunday is Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. The word is taken from the opening prayer of today's Mass, "Rejoice in the Lord always." It is a time filled with hope and trust in the Lord that our deliverance and ultimate salvation will come. Our readings today highlight the role of John the Baptist in "preparing the way of the Lord". John sent disciples to ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come?" In asking this, John wasn't merely asking "Are you the Messiah?", he was asking, are you the one of whom Isaiah prophesied when he said, "Here is your God". Jesus' answer hearkened back to the very words of this morning's first reading, when Isaiah foretold long ago about the day the Lord himself would come.



In our first reading (Isaiah 35:1-6, 10), the Prophet Isaiah described the day when God himself would intervene in Salvation history and deliver His people; a time of utter joy and gladness. The words Isaiah used are the very words Jesus will use in today's Gospel to announce to the world that indeed, Jesus is the one of whom Isaiah spoke.

Our Epistle reading is from the Letter of St. James (Jas 5:7-10). It reflects the belief at the time that Jesus' return was imminent and counseled patience and firmness of heart - a lesson still applicable today.

In our Gospel reading (Matthew 11:2-11), we hear that John the Baptist, while he was in prison, sent disciples to inquire if Jesus is "the one who is to come". Jesus replied using the words of Isaiah's well known prophesy - in effect saying, Yes, I am "the glory of the Lord, the splendor of our God." Jesus used the words of Isaiah's prophesy saying, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised". Jesus also told them that John was the one of whom the prophets also spoke when it was written, "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you."

Today is a day of great rejoicing that, at a time of God's choosing, He will come with vindication to save us. Patience! Joy! The day is near!
 May our hearts be firm!

Dear Friends,

As I write this on December 5th, we are at 92% of our goal. 325 households have contributed over \$142,000 of our \$155,000 goal. This is an average gift of \$435 per household. This is amazing and inspiring. We have set for ourselves the goal of completing our CMA responsibilities before Christmas, and I think we are going to make it for the 7th year in a row!

However, we are approaching this success with fewer participating parish households than last year, 113 fewer.

Participation is really the only way to measure how fully St. Rita parish has embraced the importance of the ministries of the Diocese and our combined responsibility to support them. What will really make this year's CMA a success is if, even after we reach our Diocesan goal, more households continue to participate.

I am sincerely thankful for everyone who has been able to participate this year, and I humbly understand that not every household is in a situation that allows them to participate. And I trust that the other households will prayerfully consider their responsibility to join in the success of our CMA and support the good work of the ministries of our Diocese.

Thank you in advance for your gifts!

I will be sure to let you know when we have reached our overall goal and I will hold off on any other CMA news until after the New Year. Thank you again!

Managing Mental Health during the Holiday Season

The Christmas season can be associated with very different sets of emotions for each of us. For some, the feelings may be joy, warmth, and excitement. For others, it can spark feelings of loneliness, worry, and stress. You may have lost a loved one since the last holiday season and are experiencing grief. If you find yourself feeling anxious or sad over the holidays, you are certainly not alone. Here are a few steps you can take during this hectic season:

Accept your feelings

Try your best to acknowledge and accept your emotions rather than place judgement on them. It's okay to feel happy; it's okay to feel sad. Give yourself compassion and allow yourself to sit with whatever you are feeling.



Maintain healthy habits and prioritize self-care

Don't use this time of year to abandon your healthy habits! Continue to eat right, get enough sleep, and exercise. It is normal that the holiday season has a tendency to challenge our routines, but maintaining healthy habits is critical to your mental health. It's also important to remember that self care is a priority. It is important to take other's needs into account, but not at the expense of your own. Take time to do things that will 'fill your cup' like reading a book, listening to music, praying, and attending Church services.



Set boundaries

It is ok to say no, especially when you are feeling overwhelmed. If attending certain events or activities add unnecessary stress to your life then it is okay to prioritize those invitations or activities and only participate in those that you are able to comfortably. Allow some breathing room in your schedule.

Accept and seek help

Connect with those close to you who offer you the most support and comfort. Reach out to those friends and family and let them know how you are feeling. There are also mental health counselors available through your Primary Care Providers who can identify and manage your needs.

In a crisis, you can call or text 988 in the Rochester area for Lifeline support.

Some of these suggestions are easier than others.

It's not about doing it all but taking small steps to manage your mental health during this season.
